

Last week, I had the distinct honor and pleasure both at Vibrant Club Seminar and at the Port Orange-South Daytona Club meeting, to help recognize and thank President Hewitt Dupont on reaching Level 2 Major Donor Status, and DS and Angela Patel for an incredible Rotary Foundation Endowment Gift, reaching Level 3 in the Arch Klumph Society!

These Rotarians not only are an inspiration to their club – they have 19 Benefactors, 6 Bequest Society members, and 8 Major Donors in a club of 56 folks – they are an inspiration to this District, and beyond!

Foundation Recognition Defined

Individual Giving

- Sustaining Member: \$100 or more per year to the Annual Fund.
- **Benefactor:** Endowment Fund as a beneficiary of \$1,000 or more in your estate plans or when you donate \$1,000 or more to the fund outright.
- **Paul Harris Fellow:** \$1,000 or more to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus, or an approved Foundation grant.
- Multiple Paul Harris Fellow: additional gifts of \$1,000 or more
- Paul Harris Society member: contribute \$1,000 or more annually to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus, or an approved Foundation grant.
- **Bequest Society:** When you make a commitment for future gifts of \$10,000 or more to Foundation,
- Major Donor: cumulative donations reach \$10,000. 4 Levels

Club Giving

- **Arch Klumph Society:** When your cumulative donations reach \$250,000. 6 Levels
- 100% Paul Harris Fellow Club: All dues-paying members are Paul Harris Fellows.
- 100% Paul Harris Society Club: every dues-paying member contributes a minimum of \$1,000
- 100% Foundation Giving Club (TRF): average of \$100 in per capita giving and 100% participation, with every dues-paying member contributing at least \$25
- 100% Rotary's Promise Club: every dues-paying member supports the Endowment \$1,000 or more in an estate plan or an outright gift of \$1,000 or more to the Endowment.
- Every Rotarian, Every Year Club (EREY): minimum *Annual Fund* contribution of \$100 per capita and every dues-paying member must personally contribute at least \$25 to the Annual Fund.
- **Top Three Per Capita in Annual Fund Giving**: top three clubs in district that give the most, per capita, to the Annual Fund.
